POSTPARTUM HEMORRHAGE

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DEFINITION

- Cumulative blood loss >1000 cc
- Bleeding associated with signs or symptoms of hypovolemic within 24 hours of birth

LABS

- CBC with platelets
- PT/PTT
- Fibrinogen (<350:<250)
- ABG (BD >-5)
- Lactate (>4.0)
- Electrolytes
- Convert T&S to T&C
- Type and Crossmatch



WHEN TO TRANSFUSE?

- Class II shock and ongoing blood loss
- Class II shock and controlled: watch
- Class III shock and ongoing blood loss
- Class III shock and bleeding controlled
- Class IV: always



KEYS TO CONTINUED INTRA-ABDOMINAL BLEEDING

- PT/PTT
- Platelets
- Rising creatinine
- Low urine output
- Abnormal vital signs
- BD increasing
