## 3. SCTA Statewide Strategy

- a. Please review the CY2023 SCTA Statewide Plan by EOB 11/23.

  - The CY2023 statewide plan was simplified this year to showcase overarching tactics under each strategy domain, followed by overarching support tactics which support each strategy domain tactic.
    - Quarterly milestones are not included in the CY23 plan, however, partners are still expected to report these milestones in their SCTA quarterly report throughout the year.
    - To draft the CY2023 strategy tactics, the SCTA leadership team met individually
      with clinical partners to discuss their CY23 plans. Individual tactics were used by
      the SCTA team to formulate collective tactics by strategy domain to encompass
      the work of the SCTA as a whole. These strategy domain tactics were shared with
      support partners as they worked to create their overarching support tactics for
      the year. These support tactics aim to improve telehealth program infrastructure
      and maximize value across all clinical domains.

### 4. Legislative and Advocacy Efforts

- a. The SCTA team met with leadership at the SC Medical Association (SCMA) in October to discuss alignment of telehealth advocacy efforts. SCMA expressed their involvement and interest in potential parity/equity initiatives.
- b. The latest extension for the federal Public Health Emergency (PHE) is effective through *January 11, 2023.* 
  - It is still unclear if an additional extension is to follow, however, HHS has promised states that it will give 60 days' notice prior to ending the PHE.
  - As it currently stands, telehealth waivers and flexibilities will not expire until 151 days after the PHE ends.
- c. Preparing for the next legislative session, Ryan Burnaugh and team plan to draft language over the coming months around the following identified priorities (subject to change):
  - Practice Act adjustments: prescribing language, requirements for controlled substance prescribing.
  - Telemedicine Act adjustments: "telemedicine" definition clean-up.
  - Originating site restriction removal in statute.
- d. The SC payer scorecard is now live on the <u>SCTA website</u> and displays various SC payers and how their telehealth coverage policies align/misalign with SCTA payer priorities. The intention of this document is to be used as a tool for SCTA partners and stakeholders, and to guide conversations with payers. This document will continuously be updated as the coverage and reimbursement landscape continues to shift. Additional payers may be added in the near future.
