WHAT IS INFANT MORTALITY

Infant mortality is the death of an infant before his or her first birthday. The infant mortality rate is the number of infant deaths for every 1,000 live births

WHAT IS MATERNAL MORTALITY

Number of deaths related to or aggravated by pregnancy (excluding accidental or incidental causes) occurring within 42 days of the end of a pregnancy

- Connects with additional services

HEALTHY START

- 3 sites in SC
- 1997
- Criteria:
 - Pregnant or delivered a special needs or low birthweight baby
 - live within the service area

Based on the Healthy
Start Performance Data
Report for 2022,
Healthy Start served a
total of 463 program
participants

91% Medicaid 93% African American 0 deaths

HOME VISITING

Based on Performance Data for Oct1,2022-Sept 30, 2023, NFP had 767 encounters with a total of 70 program participants

NURSE-FAMILY PARTNERSHIP

- 7 sites in SC
- 2015
- Criteria:
 - pregnant with 1st viable pregnancy
 - less than 29 weeks pregnant
 - live in Orangeburg county
 - meet income requirements

HOME VISITING: Process

- Referral
- Assigned for assessment
- Assessment scheduled and completed
- Assigned to a home visitor based on findings from the assessment
- Case management for up to 18-24 months post delivery
 - In person- home visits
 - Virtual visits
 - Groups in-person with a virtual option




SOCIAL DETERMINANTS IN RURAL



- higher rates of unemployment
- lower educational attainment
- less access to healthcare and social services

These factors directly affect an individual's health and well-being

higher infant and child mortality





Education is one of the strongest predictors of individual and community health.

Determinants in this category include: high school graduation, higher education, language and literacy, and childhood development.

Social and Community Context

Not all communities have a sense of togetherness. Community cohesion can play a big part in health. Determinants in this category include: civic participation, discrimination, workplace conditions, and incarceration.

Individuals who are economically insecure may have added difficulty in addressing their health needs.

Determinants in this category include: income, living cost, poverty, housing, socioeconomic status, and food security.

Neighborhoods play a big part in assessing health. Where someone lives can make a big difference. Determinants in this category include: access to transportation, healthy foods, air and water quality, and local crime and violence.
